World Language Requirements

Advanced Diploma:

At least 3 years of one language or 2 years of one language and 2 years of another language

*Recommended to stay with ONE language all the way to AP Spanish

Standard Diploma:

No language classes are specifically required

Spanish Levels 1-4

Spanish 1: basic conversational skills & present tense

Spanish 2: basic conversational skills, present & past tenses

Spanish 3: intermediate conversational skills & all nine grammar tenses

Spanish 4: intermediate conversational skills & mastery of all nine

grammar tenses; earn .5 point to your GPA

College Board Mission

- The College Board's mission is to connect students to college success and opportunity
- AP Spanish: earn an extra point towards your GPA

Focus: AP Spanish

- Provide academic rigor & challenge for ALL students.
- The main focus of the course is to develop students' proficiencies in the three modes of communication as described in the Standards for Foreign Language Learning in the 21st Century: Interpersonal, Interpretive and Presentational Communication
- Student performance is described as a <u>range of student</u> <u>proficiency</u> instead of an assumed college course equivalency (third-year college course in Spanish language)
- The course has a thematic approach: 6 themes
- The course includes a <u>focus on culture</u> as described in the Standards: cultural products, practices, and perspectives

- In order to promote an integration of language, content and culture, the courses will be structured around six broad themes:
 - global challenges
 - science and technology
 - contemporary life
 - personal and public identities
 - families and communities
 - beauty and aesthetics
- These themes will promote not only improved communication skills but also the cultural perspectives essential to global citizenry.

AP Spanish Language Test

- ▶ Section I 50% Multiple Choice
- ▶ Reading: 30 questions (40 minutes)
- ▶ Reading/Listening & Listening: 35 questions (55 minutes)
- ▶ Section II 50% Free Response
- ▶ Letter: 12.5% (15 minutes)
- Essay: 12:5% (55 minutes)
- ▶ Dialogue: 12.5% (20 sec. each response)
- ▶ Oral: 12.5% (2 minutes to respond)
